

Announcement of Union Election Commission

15 March 2021

- Regarding the Multiparty General Election held on 8 November 2020, the Union Election Commission has inspected the voter lists and the casting of votes of Htantabin, Insein and Dawbon townships in Yangon Region.
- According to the inspection, the previous election commission released 140,760 eligible voters in Htantabin Township of Yangon Region. The list of the Ministry of Labour, Immigration and Population in November 2020 showed 70,792 eligible voters who had turned 18. The voter lists mentioned that there were 20,059 citizens, associate citizens, nationalized citizens, and non-identity voters, 291 persons repeated on the voter lists more than three times and 7,276 persons repeated on the voter lists two times.
- The previous election commission released 237,230 eligible voters in Insein Township of Yangon Region. The list of the Ministry of Labour, Immigration and Population in November 2020 showed 177,687 eligible voters who had turned 18. The voter lists mentioned that there were 17,440 citizens, associate citizens, nationalized citizens, and non-identity voters, 255 persons repeated on the voter lists more than three times and 9,054 persons repeated on the voter lists two times.
- The previous election commission released 70,753 eligible voters in Dawbon Township of Yangon Region. The list of the Ministry of Labour, Immigration and Population in November 2020 showed 58,708 eligible voters who had turned 18. The voter lists mentioned that there were 7,746 citizens, associate citizens, nationalized citizens, and non-identity voters, 39 persons repeated on the voter lists more than three times and 2,084 persons repeated on the voter lists two times.
- Findings in respective townships were as follows:

- The Union Election Commission has inspected the withdrawal/receipt/use/remaining of ballot papers used for Pyithu Hluttaw Election of Htantabin, Insein and Dawbon townships in Yangon Region, together with the respective township election sub-commission, head of police force, Immigration and Population and administrator according to the Hluttaw Election Law Section 53.
- According to the ground inspection, a total of 378 polling stations of these three townships took out 486,870 ballots and used 314,564 It left 155,584 ballots instead of 172,306. A total of 22,323 ballots were missing and it also found 5,601 extra ballots. The extra/shortage ballots were found at respective poll stations. The extra ballots were found and so it seemed to print the ballots illegally. The findings in each township are as follows:

- According to the inspection, a total of 119 polling stations in 54 village-tract at No (5) Ward of Htantabin Township of Yangon Region withdrew 147,433 ballots and used 104,454 ballots. It left 42,158 ballots instead of 42,979 ballots. The shortage/extra ballots were found at each polling station The findings in each township are as follows:

- 2,336 ballots were missing at the polling stations of 23 wards/village-tracts of Htantabin Township and 10 village-tract polling stations used 235 extra ballots. The township sub-commission left 3,486 ballots instead of 2,890 ballots and so there were 596 extra ballots. Moreover, township sub-commission received 684 ballots returned by ward/village-tract.

11. According to the inspection, 196 polling stations in 21 Wards of Insein Township of Yangon Region withdrew 261,350 ballots and used 165,510 ballots. It left only 82,806 ballots instead of 95,840. The shortage/extra ballots were found at each polling station. Findings were as follows:

12. A total of 16,526 ballots were missing at the polling stations of 18 Wards in Insein Township and the polling stations in 3 Wards used 954 extra ballots. The township sub-commission received 2,538 ballots returned by some wards.

14. There were 63 polling stations in Dawbon Township and they took out 78,087 ballots and of these ballots, they distributed 75,637 ballots for ward/village-tracts, 500 for township advance ballots and 1,950 for township remaining (reserve).

15. According to the inspection, Dawbon township took out 75,637 ballots and used 44,100 ballots. They left only 28,670 ballots only 31,537.

16. A total of 3,461 ballots were missing at 37 polling stations and found 594 extra ballots at 17 polling stations.

17. They used 500 ballots as township advance ballots and it found 1,950 unused township remaining ballots (reserve) and so there was no difference on it.

18. Dawbon township used 44,600 ballots out of 78,087 ballots and if found 30,620 unused ballots.
