- 5. Upon accomplishing the provisions of the state of emergency, free and fair multiparty democratic elections will be held in line with the 2008 Constitution, and further work will be undertaken to hand over State duties to the winning party in accordance with democratic standards.

CHAIRMAN of the State Administration Council Prime Minister Senior General Min Aung Hlaing accepted the Credentials of the Ambassador of Cambodia to Myanmar Mr Chum Angvichet at the Credentials Hall of the Office of SAC Chairman in Nay Pyi Taw at 10 am yesterday.

They frankly discussed the standing of Cambodia with Myanmar, the belief of Cambodia in Myanmar's endeavours in restoring peace and stability, enhancement of diplomatic relations, friendly ties and cooperation between the two countries, assistance of Cambodia to Myanmar at a time when Covid-19 pandemic broke out, a plan of Cambodia to further provide Covid-19 vaccines, the issue to extend running of a direct flight between the two countries for the development of the tourism industry, and promotion of cooperation in religious, education and trade sectors.

Statement of Myanmar National Human Rights Commission on its activities of human rights promotion and education Statement No 7/2023

1. In accordance with the Paris Principle relating to the Status of National Institutions, the Myanmar National Human Rights Commission Law was enacted as the Pyidaungsu Hluttaw Law No 21/2014 with the objectives to safeguard the fundamental rights of citizens enshrined in the Constitution of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar, to create a society where human rights are respected and protected and to effectively promote and protect human rights. In Chapter V of the said law, promoting public awareness of human rights and efforts to combat all forms of discrimination through the provision of information and education is mentioned as one of the duties of the Commission.

2. In carrying out the two main functions of the Myanmar National Human Rights Commission, to achieve the goals of effective human rights education and awareness raising, inspiring greater public trust and confidence in MNHRC and fostering a human rights culture in Myanmar through education and awareness raising, annual operational plans have been developed and being implemented under the five–year Strategic Plan (2020-2024)

3. Since 2011 when the Myanmar National Human Rights Commission was established until now, as part of the human rights awareness-raising activities, 275 human rights educative talks have been held in all regions and states, including self-administered zones. For state employees in regions, states and districts and Civil Society Organizations (CSOs), 108 human rights workshops and training have been organized, and a total of 288 human rights lectures have been delivered at the training courses organized by Union Ministries and Civil Service Academies. Moreover, human rights education materials such as pamphlets, brochures, and posters have been printed and distributed.

4. The human rights awareness-raising activities of the Myanmar National Human Rights Commission for the public may enhance the knowledge of human rights and basic human rights concepts, resulting in the adoption of human rights-based approaches to all situations and the ability to analyze human rights perspectives. This may contribute to the protection of human rights, reduce the tendencies to violate human rights and consequently may address the violations of human rights and thereby may create a society with a human rights culture where human rights are respected, protected and observed.

First, the Vice-Senior General and party observed the losses and damage, recuse works and rehabilitation processes in Kyauktaw and Rathedaung townships.

Then, the Vice-Senior General and party met and comforted the storm victims-local people and departmental staff at the respective locations.

During the meeting, the Vice-Senior General said he came to the disaster-affected areas to check the rehabilitation activities in person according to the directive of the Prime Minister. It is such as glad case as the residents conducted rehabilitation processes for their townships,

partments concerned should collect the correct data in respective townships to distribute the relief items systematically. The SAC released the announcements declaring disaster-hit regions according to Section 11 of the Natural Disaster Management Law. Moreover, the senior military officers were assigned duties in these areas to carry out the rehabilitation processes. The people of respective townships should work together to be better than the original situation.

Then, the attendees reported on the damages and losses and the Vice-Senior

ward and villages with a strong sense of self-reliance. The people and departments concerned also should participate in the rehabilitation processes of recuse teams.

The universities and basic education schools will be opened on 1 June and so it should conduct repairing works on the destroyed schools for the students to be able to study safely and peacefully. In doing so, it should prioritize the high schools that host the largest numbers of students and it should repair the township hospital (50-bed) as quickly as possible.

It needs to collect the data to launch rehabilitation processes quickly. The de-

General provided rice, cooking oil, beans and fish paste to the victims of Mocha and departmental staff.

The Vice-Senior General and party also provided cash assistance to the members of the Bago Region Myanmar Fire Brigade who served recuse and relief measures in Rathedaung township.

Moreover, the Vice-Senior General and party went to Kyauktaw and Rathedaung stations and separately comforted the officials, other ranks and families who faced the impacts of natural disasters. The Vice-Senior General then provided foodstuffs and cordially greeted them. — MNA/KTZH

DPM MoTC Union Minister meets senior military officers who will manage rehabilitation work in Rakhine State

SAC Member Deputy Prime Minister Union Minister for Transport and Communications Admiral Tin Aung San met senior military officers who will manage rehabilitation tasks at storm-battered townships in Rakhine State yesterday and gave necessary instructions.

The meeting was attended by Union Border Affairs Minister Lt-Gen Tun Tun Naung, Rakhine State Chief Minister U Htein Lin and senior military officers.

Deputy Prime Minister Admiral Tin Aung San said that when they reach townships where they are responsible, they should prioritize collaborative efforts in clear-up of the damage caused by

the storm, restore the electricity and good communication, access to clean drinking water, school buildings to be repaired in time of school opening, reconstruction of hospitals, monasteries, provision of foodstuffs, medicines, medical supplies and construction materials sent by the government to be systematically and rapidly distributed to storm-affected people, supervision of correct statistics, and urgent matters to be submitted in a timely manner.

120 new cases of COVID-19 reported on 19 May, total figure registers 637,855

MYANMAR'S COVID-19-positive cases rose to 637,855 after 120 new cases were reported on 19 May 2023 according to the Ministry of Health. Therefore, a total of 10,556,815 laboratory samples were examined and the confirmed COVID-19 cases reached 637,855. The total number of patients who have recovered from COVID-19 in the country reached 616,665 including 92 new recoveries.

The death toll from COVID-19 in the country registered 19,494 on 19-5-2023 with no new death reported from the pandemic. COVID-19 information can be browsed on the internet page moh.gov.mm of the Ministry of Health. — GNLM







National Economic Promotion Fund Management Committee Meeting 3/2023 held



Deputy Prime Minister U Win Shein chairs the third National Economic Promotion Fund Management Committee meeting yesterday.

THE 3/2023 meeting of the National Economic Promotion Fund Management Committee was held at the meeting hall of the Ministry of Planning and Finance in Nay Pyi Taw yesterday morning.

Committee Chairman, Deputy Prime Minister and Union Minister for Planning and Finance U Win Shein said that the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Irrigation has been given a grant of K230 billion from the national economic promotion fund (K400 billion), and K10 billion each to Kayah, Chin and Rakhine States, K8 billion each to Kachin, Kayin, Mon, Shan States and Taninthayi Region and five billion kyats each to six self-administered zones totalling K330 billion.

Of the remaining K70 billion of the national economic promotion funds, K50 billion were approved for the establishment of the oil industry development loan fund and K20 billion were approved for the development

of animal husbandry, he stated.

A total of K52 billion from the balance of the National Natural Disaster Management Fund was transferred to the National Economic Promotion Fund and K10 billion each was given to Sagaing Region and Magway Region.

K8 billion each has been given to Bago Region, Mandalay Region, Yangon Region and Ayeyawady Region. Therefore, the total disbursement from the National Economic Promotion Fund is K452 billion.

He focused on obtaining loan guarantees according to location, ensuring regular repayment of principal/interest during the term of the loan, and regular repayment of principal/interest after one year from the date the loan was started even though the loan has not yet reached maturity.

He continued to discuss issues related to state and regional loans and loan verification. A vir-

tual meeting will be held in the Chin State and Kayah State and loan issues will be checked, he commented.

At the meeting, he expressed that he would like to have a round discussion and make recommendations on the issue of being able to provide a special loan presented by Mon State and the issue of extending the term of the loan presented by Chin State.

Along with issuing funds for the agriculture sector, he focused on supervising and increasing the funds without losing them.

Next, members of the National Economic Promotion Fund Management Committee: Union Ministers U Min Naung, Dr Charlie Than, Deputy Minister U Maung Maung Win, U Nyunt Aung and officials discussed findings and requirements according to the relevant sectors, and the chairman of the committee coordinated the presentations. — MNA/KZL

MoH Union Minister discusses healthcare services for Mocha-hit areas

UNION Health Minister Dr Thet Khaing Win inspected the damage after Cyclone Mocha and repairing works at Food and Drugs Administration Department Office in Sittway Township together with relevant officials yesterday.

At noon, the Union minister attended the coordination meeting on healthcare services for storm-affected areas held in Nay Pyi Taw.

During the meeting, the Union minister highlighted the

preparations in the health sector in each township of Rakhine State that were hit by Cyclone Mocha, current and ongoing work plans to analyze the needs after the cyclone, adding chlorine to the lakes and wells, distribution of water purification tablets, medicines and medical supplies to prevent diarrhoea, quick response to communicable disease, sending of RRT (Rapid Response Team) and medical teams and other matters.

Then, officials of the Pub-

lic Health Department, Medical Services Department and FDA reported on the destroyed rural health centres and branches clinics, Sittway General Hospital, district and township hospitals and dispensaries and office buildings.

The Union minister then stressed the need to spend the fund effectively for maintenance under the current expenditure of 2023-2024FY and conduct long-term and short-term plans for repairing works. — MNA/KTZH

MoC Union Minister oversees progress on temporary Bailey bridge for damaged Thechaung bridge

UNION Construction Minister U Myo Thant met the director-general, the deputy directors-general and chief engineers of the Department of Buildings and staff in Rakhine State at the director's office of the Department of Highways in Rakhine State yesterday.

The Union minister emphasized the urgency of promptly repairing the roofs of both offices and residential buildings in townships. Pri-

oritizing the ministry's paramount duty of preserving road connectivity, he stressed ensuring the cleanliness of roads through efficient vehicle mechanisms.

Then, Director-General U Myo Myint of the Department of Buildings, the deputy directors-general, and chief engineers explained cooperation procedures and the Union Minister ordered officials to coordinate with the relevant

ministries and Rakhine state government.

Subsequently, the Union minister and party proceeded to the construction site, located at milepost No 2/4 along the Sittway-Palinpyin Road, where the construction of a 140-footlong and 18-foot-wide temporary Bailey bridge was underway to replace the Thechaung bridge that had suffered damage in the storm. — MNA/KZW

Paper-reading sessions, parallel discussions continue at Myanmar National Education Conference 2023

THE Myanmar National Education Conference 2023 continued at the Myanmar International Convention Centre-II in Nay Pyi Taw yesterday morning with parallel discussions for the second day.

Seven parallel discussions took place under seven titles, and resource persons read six papers in each group of panel discussions with the active participation of attendees.

Parallel discussion 1 submitted papers on regional administration, social organizations and cooperation, the creation of a healthy and happy learning society, assessment on the effectiveness of continuous assessment system, cooperation between monastic educations and private schools, and proper balance of students ratio to teachers.

Parallel discussion 2 comprised paper presentations on high enrolment rate, schooling and high transition of learning, fulfilling needs of students in learning, training teachers to enhance capacity, turning out good citizens with actual literate, patriotic and national spirits and teaching good

knowledge and behaviours in basic education curriculums, and completion of school-age children in KG+9 scheme including those from border regions.

Resource persons also read their papers on the enhancement of public awareness to know learning opportunities for technical vocation and training, the extended opening of training schools to give technical, vocational and training in post-KG+9 education, appointment of teachers for post-KG+9 education and enhancement of capacity, further strengthening of curriculums, assessment, qualification guarantee and management in the technical sector of the post-KG+9 education, further strengthening of curriculums, assessment, qualification guarantee and management in agriculture and livestock sector of the post-KG+9 education, and recognization certification for basic education high school by the Ministry of Education and creation of opportunities for those who completed technical, agriculture and livestock breeding high schools and vocational training schools to learn

education for a lifetime in the parallel discussion 3.

Parallel discussion 4 staged the papers on the extension of learning opportunities for applying for technical vocational courses and turning out human resources, the extension of learning opportunities for applied agriculture and livestock breeding vocational courses and turning out human resources, exposing the plans for employment opportunities jointly organized by the government, private sector, partner

organizations and workplaces, betterment of curriculum on modern technical and vocational subjects, enhancement of vocational education to develop socioeconomic life, and creation of chances for implementing a durable vocational education system.

Parallel discussion 5 presented the papers on teaching higher education in the environment to contribute to society in addition to having subject-wise skills, technology applied pedagogical and management system implementation, education system based on outcomes which can improve learning result, betterment of university structures and beautification of the university campus, modernization of outcomes-based curriculums, and further turning out economists for the economic development of the State.

Parallel discussion 6 mentioned the papers on inserting the graduation research project plans for undergraduate courses, the important role of higher education in the existence of natural resources and environment, food security based on technologies, the connection between university and workplace, enhancement of applied research for MSME businesses, and adoption of a framework for the development of research.

Parallel discussion 7 emphasized the papers on the insertion of plans for the adequate number of teachers in the education sector, reduction of teacher depletion and convenience in workplaces, attendance to pre-job training and on-job training, and enhancement of the capacity of teachers in technical, vocational and training sectors. In the afternoon, the paper on teacher competency standards framework and IQA to enhance the qualification of teachers, and continuous training for qualification of teachers.

Attendees participated in discussions and gave suggestions.

Students, teachers and people as well as trainees from maritime and aviation youth courses visited the education booths of the conference.

Tatmadaw (Air) transports foodstuffs, relief items to **Rakhine State**

THE relief materials and food items contributed by families of Tatmadaw (Army, Navy and Air) and well-wishers and relief supplies provided by the National Disaster Management Committee for local communities affected by the natural disaster in Rakhine State are being transported by Tatmadaw aircraft, helicopters and vessels.

A contingent of 25 personnel, comprising health workers and relief teams from the Yangon Region, was deployed to offer essential relief and healthcare services in the affected area. The relief materials, including donated items such as biscuits, 500 cartons of duck eggs, 19 cartons of solar equipment, 97 cartons of medical supplies, 300 cartons of instant noodles, five cartons of sardine cans, 10 cartons of porridge, 8 packages of electrolyte salt, and 267 CI sheets donated by India, were transported nine

times by Tatmadaw plane from Mingaladon Airport in Yangon to Sittway Airport. In a similar, in the Sagaing Region, a total of 358 personnel from the Myanmar Police Force, from the Police Training Depot in Sagaing, were mobilized to assist in the ongoing relief operations. These dedicated individuals were transported five times via Tatmadaw planes, facilitating their swift deployment from TadaU Airport to Sittway Airport. Mandalay Region Chief Minister U Myo Aung, Central Command Commander Maj-Gen Ko Ko Oo and officials gave cash awards and foodstuffs to the rescue members.

In addition, the training depot will continue to send up to 600 members of the Myanmar Police Force.



Japanese media raise AI copyright concerns, call for measures

AN association run by Japanese mass media on Wednesday warned against recent developments in artificial intelligence, noting that it may lead to the unauthorized use of copyrighted work and hinder news organizations from producing quality content.

The Japan Newspaper Publishers & Editors Association in a written opinion piece called on the government to implement legal measures to counteract the potential negative effects of AI, and said "the public's right to know may be hampered" if the quality of news content falls.

Media organizations hold copyrights and other legal rights to its articles,

photographs and videos, but concerns have been raised over the unauthorized use of the works, the association wrote.

The association is an independent organization funded and operated by

daily newspapers, news agencies and broadcasters

Japan amended its copyright law in 2018 to allow, in principle, AI to collect and utilize copyrighted works without permission. But the law did not anticipate the negative effects of advanced or generative AI, it added.

Furthermore, generative AI occasionally produced erroneous information, raising the risks of countless users believing what it says.

"The ability of AI to generate a large number of articles in a short time can be exploited to spread disinformation...to mislead public opinion," the association said. Generative AI may also lead to the unauthorized collection of large amounts of personal data, such as a person's race, religion or medical history, and its potential misuse, the association said. — Kyodo

China ends import ban on Australian timber

CHINA has lifted an import ban on Australian timber, Beijing's ambassador said Thursday, as once-frosty ties between the two countries thaw.

Xiao Qian told reporters in Canberra that China would resume imports of Australian timber as of Thursday after Beijing

clamped down on the trade in 2020.

"Yesterday, the Chinese Customs have formally notified the Australian Minister of Agriculture that starting from today, China will resume import of Australian timber," Xiao said at a press conference in Canberra. — AFP



Collective cleanup, rehabilitation activities performed on main roads, urban areas of Sittway

REHABILITATION activities are being carried out in Rakhine State, which was hit by a storm on 14 May. Members of the Tatmadaw, Myanmar Police Force, Fire Services Department, departmental staff, and residents conducted cleanup and rehabilitation tasks yesterday morning for the regular improvement of traffic and communication routes in Sittway's main roads and neighbourhoods.

In repairing damaged buildings in Sittway, schools and universities are being restored as a high priority before the opening of schools on 1 June. The 500-bed general hospital and religious buildings have also been re-

Likewise, to ensure that the urban population has enough clean drinking water, the Department of Rural Development is distributing drinking water with mobile water purifiers that can supply 660 gallons of water per hour.

To get electricity in the city

as soon as possible, the employees of the relevant ministries replaced and erected the lamp posts that had fallen due to the storm using large machines, performed transmission of electric cables, cleared dangerous power lines, replaced and installed new communication cables to restore communication and re-installed communication towers.


Military personnel, members of the Myanmar Police Force, and the Fire Services Department cooperated in clearing up fallen trees, cutting down dangerous trees, clearing bushes, and conducting collective cleaning activities in the precinct of the Lawkananda Pagoda (Sittway).

In addition, foodstuffs, medicines, medical supplies, rescue equipment, and construction equipment needed by storm victims in Sittway are delivered daily by military aircraft, vessels, and vehicles. To facilitate the travel of the local people, passenger flights have been running regularly since 18 May.

Members of the Fire Services Department, departmental staff, and residents are working together daily to perform debris clearance and rehabilitation measures in Rathedaung, Kyauktaw, Ponnagyun, and Pauktaw townships that were severely affected by the storm.

Causalities, losses and damage across nation after Cyclone Mocha

THE casualties, losses and damage in Myanmar caused by the severe cyclonic storm Mocha in the Bay of Bengal on 14 May are being released in a timely manner.

According to the investigation until 19 May noon, a total of 183,024 houses, 1,711 religious buildings, 59 monasteries, 1,397 schools, 227 hospitals and clinics, 11 telecom towers, 119 lamp posts, five transformers, one market, two airport buildings and 340 departmental buildings were destroyed in respective regions and states, and 145 locals of Rakhine State were killed.

In the cyclone-affected areas, the rescue teams in respective regions and states are undertaking rescue and relief measures together with volunteer organizations, and officials concerned went to the sites and provided necessary assistance. — MNA/KTZH

MPBMSMA donates K50 mln, corrugated sheets, and nails for Mocha-affected areas

THE Myanmar Pulses, Beans, Maize and Sesame Seeds Merchants Association (MPBMS-MA) donated K50 million, corrugated sheets, and nails for areas affected by Mocha.

In addition to donating K50 million to the people in the affected areas due to Mocha, 21,000 corrugated iron sheets and 775 visses of nails were donated by the MPBMSMA, which is the associated organ-

ization of the Union of Myanmar Federation of Chambers of Commerce and Industry (UM-FCCI), to the We Love Rakhine organization.

The UMFCCI reportedly donated K200 million for the damage caused by Mocha on 15 May.

G-7 leaders visit World Heritage shrine, dine at traditional inn

THE leaders of the Group of Seven industrialized nations visited a small island in Hiroshima Bay containing a world heritage shrine and sat down to a working dinner at a traditional hot-spring inn there at the end of the first day of their summit Friday.

Prime Minister Fumio Kishida and other leaders arrived at Miyajima Island, a popular tourist destination in the Seto Inland Sea, on a cruiser, while US President Joe Biden arrived separately in a helicopter.

The leaders posed for the traditional summit family photo before the large "torii" gate of the Itsukushima Shrine. "Gagaku" music traditionally performed there was played as they listened to a briefing on the history of the shrine, which, according to its website, was established on the site in 593.

Their working dinner was held at Iwaso, an inn that dates

back to 1854. Earlier in the day before they sat down for talks in

the afternoon they made a historic joint visit to the Hiroshima Peace Park that commemorates the lives lost to the atomic bomb attack on the city by the United States on 6 August 1945.

Itsukushima Shrine was registered by the UN Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization as a World Cultural Heritage site in 1996.

In 2016, then-Foreign Minister Kishida similarly brought his G-7 counterparts to the island during their meeting in Hiroshima, and they enjoyed a traditional music performance at the shrine. Following attacks on Kishida and a former Japanese leader in the last year, security has been tight at the annual summit. As part of the measures, Miyajima Island has been closed off to all but residents and authorized personnel, with its reopening set for Saturday afternoon. - Kyodo

Xi, Central Asian leaders announce inauguration of summit mechanism

CHINESE President Xi Jinping and leaders of five Central Asian countries announced on Friday a decision to officially inaugurate the China-Central Asia Summit Mechanism. The two sides - China and Central Asian countries - will take turns to host the biennial summit. The announcement was made in Xi'an, northwest China's Shaanxi Province, where the first China-Central Asia Summit was held on Thursday and Friday. - Xinhua

UK, Norway, ink undersea infrastructure protection tie-up

BRITAIN and Norway's defence ministers on Thursday agreed to develop a strategic partnership to protect critical energy undersea infrastructure amid fears of possible Russian sabotage.

The EU last year said leaks in two major gas pipelines from Russia to Europe had been caused by sabotage but stopped short of explicitly accusing the Kremlin. - AFP

Countdown begins for G20 meet in Kashmir

THE stage is all set for the third G20 tourism working group meeting scheduled to take place in Srinagar, the summer capital of Jammu and Kashmir from 22-24 May 2023 under India's presidency. According to a report, there has been a resurgence of confidence among the youth that foreign tourists would soon start travelling to Kashmir in great numbers. Tourism, the backbone of Jammu and Kashmir's economy absorbs the labour force from unskilled to the unorganized sector, which gives impetus to educational unemployment.

Kirmani Aafaq, a recent pass-out graduate from Government Degree College, in north Kashmir's Baramulla district expressed his optimism that the

Tensions high as Israel nationalists march into east Jerusalem

TENS of thousands of Israeli nationalists marched to Jerusalem's Old City on Thursday in an annual flag-waving march commemorating Israel's capture of it, as tensions on the Gaza border remained high.

Palestinians in annexed east Jerusalem closed their shops and were banned from the Damascus Gate entrance to the Old

City, a social hub, to make way for the marchers, some of whom attacked journalists with rocks and bottles, an AFP reporter said.

Police said they made two arrests over the attack, one of an adult and one of a minor.

The United States, Israel's main ally, on Thursday condemned demonstrators' "racist" chants against Arabs, with AFP reporters saying that many of the marchers had shouted anti-Arab slogans.

"The United States unequivocally opposes racist language of any form. We condemn the hateful chants such as 'Death to Arabs' during today's marches in Jerusalem," State Department spokesman Matthew Miller wrote on Twitter. - AFP

Team Myanmar is falling in

the same group as China, Nepal, and China Taipei. Myanmar will take on Nepal on 6 June, China Taipei on 8 June, and China on 10 June during the second-round qualifiers. All team Myanmar matches will start at 6:30 pm Myanmar Standard Time, the MFF stated. — KZL

West Ham boss Moyes reveals family concern after violence at **AZ Alkmaar**

WEST Ham manager David Moyes admitted he was concerned for the safety of his family after AZ Alkmaar hooligans attacked Hammers fans following Thursday's Europa Conference League semi-final in the Netherlands. Pablo Fornals' stoppage-time goal sealed a 1-0 victory that booked West Ham's first European final appearance for 47 years.

But the semi-final second leg was marred by ugly scenes when a gang of black-shirted, hooded AZ fans attempted to storm into the area reserved for friends and family of the West Ham players and management.

West Ham stars including Michail Antonio, Said Benrahma, Aaron Cresswell and Flynn Downes climbed over the advertising hoardings in a bid to stop the trouble. Moyes, whose 87-year-old father was at the match, said: "I can't explain what happened and why it happened.

Howe ready for Euro challenge as Newcastle eye Champions League

EDDIE Howe says Newcastle will need more quality and depth in their squad next season if they are to cope with the demands of a potential Champions League campaign.

Howe's side are guaranteed to at least reach the Europa League after thrashing Brighton 4-1 on Thursday.

But the third placed Magpies have a lucrative Champions League berth within their grasp. They will be certain of qualifying if they win one of their last two games against Leicester on Monday or Chelsea on 28 May. Newcastle boss Howe has spent over £250 million (\$310 million) to revitalize his squad since taking charge in 2021 and he knows further investment in new signings will be required to compete in the Premier League and Europe next term.

"We need to figure that out. If you have a strong squad, rotation will be important. Rotation is going to be important, utilising the whole squad is going to be important," he told reporters on Friday.

"We haven't felt the necessity to necessarily do that on a consistent basis because we've been in one competition - of course, we had the League Cup run. We have rotated to a degree, but maybe not in the numbers that we might need to next year". - AFP
